Presentation of EAAP to national members

The European Federation for Animal Science (EAAP, www.eaap.org/) is a non-profit international organization that aims to promote research, dialogue and dissemination of animal science findings amongst scientific communities, agri-food industries, civil society and groups with interests in sustainable livestock production. The federation was founded in 1949, and has its headquarters in Rome, Italy.

The EAAP has currently 34 member countries, 24 of which are members of the European Union and three belong to the Mediterranean area. These country members participate in the governance of EAAP through its General Assembly, where all members are represented and have a vote, and the Council, where 10 council members representing these countries are in charge of the day-to-day management of EAAP. We currently have more than 4600 individual members from over 900 institutions.

In the case of Switzerland, the representative is the Swiss Association for Animal Science, which allows all Swiss residents and members of the Association to become individual members of EAAP for free (members.eaap.org/apply). Individual members have access to all the activities and information generated by EAAP and become part of the largest network in animal science, which provides excellent opportunities for knowledge exchange, dissemination and partnership at the European level and beyond.

Our scientific structure involves 11 Study Commissions, focused on livestock species (Cattle, Pigs, Sheep and Goat, Horses, Insects) or disciplines (Genetics, Health and Welfare, Nutrition, Physiology, Livestock Farming Systems, Precision Livestock Farming), and 14 Working Groups, dealing with specific regions or emerging topics (https://www.eaap.org/study-commissions/). Across these groups, the Young EAAP integrates researchers in their early career, offering specific activities and scholarships. Vacant positions are open in these commissions every year for scientists and industry representatives.

The most well-known activity of EAAP is our Annual Meeting, one of the most important animal science meetings in the world, and certainly the most important in Europe and the Mediterranean area. The last one was held in Porto (Portugal) from the 5th to the 9th of September 2022 (www.eaap2022.org/), and in the following years we will meet in Lyon (2023), Florence (2024) and Innsbruck (2025). Information from past and future meetings is available on the EAAP website, as well as the publications, presentations and videos offered by the speakers at these meetings (https://meetings.eaap.org/, https://members.eaap.org/). Throughout the year we also organize industry workshops, conferences and training courses, as well as monthly webinars on different topics related to animal science and livestock industry

(https://meetings.eaap.org/webinar/). EAAP also participates as partner in charge of the dissemination of 12 EU projects (https://www.eaap.org/eu-projects/).

Our dissemination network consists of our website, social media and biweekly newsletters, together with other publications like our Books of Abstracts or our journals. Regarding the latter, EAAP is part of the animal consortium, responsible for the publication of the academic journal animal, animal-science proceedings, and animal – open space, all published by Elsevier (animal-journal.eu/). EAAP is also partner in the journal Animal Frontiers (academic.oup.com/af), aimed for larger dissemination of global issues in animal agriculture.

Finally, EAAP cooperates with several partners at the European and global level, fostering the interaction between science, the agri-food and livestock industry, civil society and policy representatives, especially those involved with agriculture and research programmes. Our network comprises the national animal science societies that are part of the federation, as well as other international societies like the World Association for Animal Production, the Latin American Association for Animal Production, Canadian and American Societies of Animal Science, and the American Dairy Science Association, with which we have a regular exchange of speakers and scholarships. EAAP also collaborates with the major international organizations in the field of animal farming, like the UN Food and Agriculture Organization, the World Organization for Animal Health, the International Centre for Advanced Mediterranean Agronomic Studies, the Animal Task Force, the European Regional Focal Point for Genetic Resources or the International Committee for Animal Recording, with which we organize regular meetings and joint sessions.
